Editor Comments **Listen to the Ugandan manufacturer**

e. *BUBU Magazine* are proud to associate with the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Cooperatives, under whose docket Buy Uganda Build Uganda Policy is implemented.

Five years into the BUBU policy implementation, there are indicators that it is making progress.

Yet whereas manufacturing and industrial development are not an exclusive preserve of specific individuals, it is only reasonable that the incentives attendant to the investors setting up shop apply universally. Some indigenous Ugandan manufacturers are concerned that it is not unusual that the task of securing land for developing their production facilities is close to impossible to them.

Further, whereas Uganda National Bureau of Standards is the best thing to happen to Uganda's nascent manufacturing, the bureau needs to have the means to deliver on its mandate; to develop and promote standardisation.

The fact is that the national treasury secures 60 percent of the revenue this bureau raises from applicants for standards; with the 40 percent balance, the Bureau cannot reasonably be expected to deliver 100 percent on its mandate.

The irony is that for the intricacies in UNBS operations funding, BUBU promotion and implementation are apparently alongside the obstruction of local manufacturing and standards development.

Further, while we commend expatriate industrialists for setting up shop and employing Uganda's employable youth, stark reality is that despite their paper qualifications, Ugandan youth technical rating cannot be spoken of for the lack of practical competencies. They are largely up to products assembling, yet under close expatriate instruction and supervision.

As BUBU progresses into the sixth year of implementation, it is an opportune time to up the ante and streamline the noble BUBU implementation and industrialisation objectives.

The affirmative products competitiveness promotion

iven the expanding middle income class, increasing population, improving products and services quality, expanding manufacturing sector and government commitment to increase salaries, BUBU will continue to better impact Ugandan's local manufacturers and service providers, says the state minister for Trade.

Hon Hariet Ntabazi was assessing BUBU policy impact implementation over the first five years.

The Discussion:

Please comment on the areas of trade and industry where BUBU Policy has scored high or low; and why.

This question gives me an opportunity to evaluate Buy Uganda Build Uganda (BUBU) policy impact on the priority sectors. It focuses on: footwear, textiles, cement, Iron and steel products, foods and beverages, and pharmaceuticals. Others are furniture, electrical cables and conductors, educational services, non-consultancy services, accounting and auditing, construction services and

construction materials.

We the choice of the above sectors on the ability and potential we possess as a country to reliably supply quality to domestic and international markets. Over the goneby five years of implementing BUBU, it is the construction sector that has been the biggest beneficiary, followed by pharmaceuticals and textiles.

The benefits to the construction sector have majorly been through subcontracting of roads and public works, maintenance and renovation. These achievements are due to opportunities offered through public procurement resulting from the NRM Government commitment to expand the tarmac road network.

The sector could have benefitted more but most of the local construction companies lack enough equipment and funds to solely undertake high-value construction projects. Indeed, a number of construction projects are contractor-financed, which limits local participation. The footwear sector has not benefited as much as we expected. This is because most of the players are SMEs which concentrate on producing craft shoes rather than office, party and sport shoes. The few who produce office and party shoes sell them at exorbitant prices, at an average of Shs 130,000, whereas local manufacturers have failed to cope up with the ever-changing consumer tastes and preferences.

Whereas some regional economies impose non-tariff barriers, to the detriment of Ugandan exports, it is not Uganda government policy to respond in kind. Please talk of how Ugandan manufacturers are advised to cope and with what outcomes.

Over the years, Uganda has had challenging experiences with some neighbours' banning of our exports into their territories. This is in contravention of our regional The BUBU campaign implementation is one of the affirmative actions the government undertakes to promote Ugandan products' competitiveness. The state of insecurity along Uganda's borders and transit routes amounts to non-tariff barriers, restricting our regional trade and hence as we write, there is almost no trade between Uganda and the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) across the Bunagana border.

It is, therefore, prudent to promote domestic consumption, look for alternative export markets, diversify into other areas and study the possibilities of producing in those countries (that bar our goods), preferably with government support. Nonetheless, government has always entered into negotiations which have resulted into the reopening of such closed borders to Ugandan exports.

Please share any other BUBU related information you wish the public to know of.

The BUBU campaign implementation is one of the affirmative actions the government undertakes to promote Ugandan products' competitiveness. This is in respect to enhancing the local manufacturers and service suppliers' capacity to supply reliable and quality products within specified timelines. It also promotes patriotism, given that BUBU supports Ugandans' efforts in keeping with Uganda's development agenda.

My Ministry implements a number of activities aimed at creating more impact to the local manufacturers and service providers. We have carried out visits to manufacturers to assess their achievements, challenges and to develop solutions.

The challenges identified include the non-compliance to orders and delayed payments by certain MDAs, the high cost of production mainly due to high electricity tariffs and a negative mindset.

Consequently, the ministry engages the MDAs and hence deadlines are set to effect payments. The ministry has also contracted a private marketing company to interest young people into consuming local products, in a bid to address the issue of the negative mindset.

Uganda's private sector is dominated by micro small and medium enterprises which in most cases cannot afford marketing costs. To address the matter, my ministry has requested local governments, especially the cities and municipalities, to identify land to set up BUBU marketing centres.

They will promote local textiles, furniture, footwear and any other two major locally produced products. The enterprises in these centres will simply pay management and maintenance fees (which will be decided by them) to their local councils. This is expected to reduce the cost of doing business for such enterprises.

Together with the Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Cooperatives, the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority and relevant stakeholders have revised the Reservation Schemes Guidelines into the Reservation and Preference Schemes Regulations.

The regulation cover more products and cater for the enterprises owned and managed by youth, women and persons with disabilities and have special offers for local enterprises.

I am a ware of the high cost of quality certification, high cost of capital and comprehensive incentives regimes for start-ups. To counter these challenges, my ministry constituted a Technical Working Group to develop an appropriate policy and legal framework of interventions to support the establishment, growth and sustainability of start-ups in Uganda.

Start-ups are the key in spurring economic growth that they originate innovations, foreign direct investments, are youth-dominated and cause positive disruptions in the sector or country; start-ups such as fintechs and energy companies have attracted US\$409 million. They would have attracted more foreign direct investments if their challenges had been addressed.

A reduction in the cost of quality

certification and the implementation of compulsory standards of products which have a direct impact on health and safety of life, have contributed to improved local products' quality to the existing 70 per cent score.

I am grateful to the local manufacturer, service provider and consumer who have supported the BUBU campaign. I pledge to keep addressing the challenges facing the local enterprises especially in respect to reducing the cost of investment capital, negative mindset and non-compliance to BUBU and public procurement procedures.

I urge local manufacturers and service providers to continue supporting the BUBU campaign and, where necessary, diversify, partner with international companies as a market penetration strategy and table challenges to the government for solutions.

I urge individual consumers to prioritize locally made Ugandan products because by so doing, you support employment opportunities creation, increase the prospects for household incomes and better livelihoods for those living now and in the future.

The NRM government is committed to addressing all challenges facing local manufacturers and service providers for the betterment of our country.

Fellow Ugandans, if we can have 40% of our wardrobe including shoes locally made in Uganda, buy local furniture, use Ugandan made stationery increase the consumption of our coffee from the dismal 4% to 15% and consume Ugandan honey, then the drive to create wealth prosperity and industrialise our country will be a given,

Remember a better future for us and generations to come majorly relies on us.

I therefore, urge to take it upon ourselves to support our local manufacturers and service providers to purchase the above and other products.

Domestic consumption The building of local products' competitiveness

lthough Government procurement has tremendously increased during Buy Uganda Build Uganda (BUBU) implementation, domestic consumption through ordinary channels of commerce has not been that significant. BUBU Magazine sought out the Commissioner for Internal Trade, Mr. Zapkey Kalega whose docket includes BUBU, for his impression of this policy's performance over the last five years.

The Discussion:

You directly relate to BUBU Policy implementation, now in its fifth year; please share what you perceive to be the qualitative change the policy has impacted on production and internal trade

Before the implementation of the policy the government was procuring a lot of its services and goods from

foreign companies. This has changed tremendously with over 39 per cent government procurement of local goods and services, which has enhanced local production of cement and iron and steel construction products. The average utilization capacity previously estimated at less than 47 per cent has increased to more than 56 per cent.

Ugandan supermarkets were before BUBU policy implementation typically filled with imported products, even

though they could even be sourced locally; whereas the shelf space allocation for local products that stood was less than 15 per cent is now over 50 per cent. This is a very big achievement in supporting the SMEs in agro-processing, footwear and furniture production.

Further, Ugandan products quality has improved by about 70 per cent consequent to the stringent quality requirements by government MDAs, reduction in the cost of quality certification and enforcement of compulsory standards.

A number of newly introduced locally made products like masks, salt, sanitizers, radios, television sets, tiles, and automobiles and telephone devices.

While Ugandan SMEs are bracing for a foothold on the local and export markets, the government continues to invite expatriate investors to set up shop in Uganda. Please talk of the mechanisms in place for enabling the nascent manufacturer to steady and mature alongside the better endowed newcomers.

Government is aware of the advantages that foreign-sourced investors come with over local investors. However, we do not have control over the incentives regimes in such countries; government has in place incentives to promote local investors.

Uganda Development Bank has been capitalized to the tune of Shs 500billion to facilitate cheaper provision of development capital at 12 per cent interest rate, below commercial banks' lending rate of over 23 per cent. We are, however, aware that investment capital in many developed countries is obtained at less than five per cent interest rate.

The investment Code Act has a low threshold of US\$250,000 as a requirement for local investors to qualify for incentives to manufacture in Uganda. The Reservation Scheme Guidelines under the PPDAAct provide



thresholds, goods and services to be supplied to government institutions by only local manufacturers.

These include textiles, pharmaceuticals, electrical cables and conductors and supplies of less than Shs 400million and nonconsultancy services of less than Shs200million. Other opportunities are public works at less than Shs 10billion, road works at less than Shs 45billion and subcontracting of roadworks to local contractors in case of contracts of more than Shs45billion which are won by foreign contractors.

Further, there are tax incentives for local content participation in the form of tax exemptions under the Excise Act and Income Tax Act provided local content is over 70 per cent.

Government is in the process of establishing eighteen (18) well -facilitated industrial parks, offering the entire necessary infrastructure. This support is targeted at local investors and is expected to provide industrial spaces for manufacturers at reduced costs (land and utilities) hence cutting production expenses.

Government has replaced performance bonds with declarations to support local contractors and service suppliers to participate in public procurement. A declaration is a commitment document whereas a performance bond is money required by the procuring entity as confirmation of performance/ services to be delivered.

Please share any other BUBUrelated information you wish the public to know of.

Government is working around the clock to address the challenges related to delayed payments, and the poor quality and standards of some products, negative mindset and capacity issues.

Domestic consumption is the key in building the competitiveness of local products in terms of quality, reliability and sustainability of supply. Competitive local producers are critical to penetrating regional and international markets; indeed the international brands Ugandans are fond of were first significantly consumed back in the respective markets of their origin.

Therefore, the first step is to provide a domestic market is to nurture the locally made brands. I urge all prospective consumers to prioritize the purchase of local products; I appreciate those who have supported the BUBU campaign for the last five years.

UNBS Promotes BUBU



UNBS has engaged Uganda Freight Forwarders Association (UFFA) on the Digital Conformity Marking (DCM). Patricia Bageine Ejalu, Deputy Executive Director - Standards, UNBS.

Accordingly, the bureau offers an incentive of free certification to the SMEs to enable their access to the market.

ENIN

Uganda National Bureau of Standards (UNBS) gives confidence that Uganda-made products are safe, of appropriate quality and provide value for money, much like the imports of a similar category. Our focus is on ensuring that their standards exceed those of the imports," Mr. David Livingstone Ebiru UNBS Executive Director, says.

Essentially, the board's mandate is promotion of Buy Uganda Build Uganda (BUBU) policy, in keeping with the import substitution and export promotion strategy of government. For applying international certification standards, Ugandan products' quality is at par with similar ones made in any part of the world; the board subjects them to conformity assessment; they are evaluated and certified on the basis of international quality and safety standards.



Thus UNBS promotes locally made products' consumption, exports products volume increase to international markets, whilst ensuring that the country imports less of the products that Uganda manufactures.

UNBS is a statutory body under the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Cooperative established by the UNBS Act Cap 327. It became operational in 1989, under the governance of National Standard Council and headed by the Executive Director.

Its mandate is to formulate and promote standards use and enforcement and to protect public health and safety and the environment against dangerous and sub-standard products. Thus it ensures fairness in trade and precision in industry through reliable measurement systems. It also strengthens the economy to enhance the exports' competitiveness in the regional and international markets.

The fulfillment of its mandate saves the country's foreign currency outflow and has increased locally made exports and hence more foreign currencies earnings. Available statistics indicate that Uganda's exports in 2022 increased by 74 percent to USD 507.5 million by August of 2022.

Uganda's exports are largely agricultural products like coffee, tea, cotton, oil and fish, among others. "We

intend to reverse the existing balance of payment by spending much less on exports. This will be possible when UNBS certified products access all markets in the world, changing Ugandan products' trending, Ebiru says.

UPLIFTING THE MANUFACTURERS

UNBS gives incentives to manufacturers by allowing them to import raw materials, machinery and other inputs for value addition and manufacturing in Uganda.

It gives waivers on some of the conformity assessment requirements, whereas imports for general trade are subjected to conformity assessment, while excluding the local products to increase their production within the country and discourage the importations.

UNBS Board has also advised the manufacturers of similar products, say fruits juices or cosmetics, to form associations, to enable UNBS to provide them with standardized services including training to produce internationally competitive goods.

CHALLENGES

The government has since stopped buying maize and beans from non-UNBS-certified suppliers, Ebiru says. production of substandard goods. Accordingly, the bureau offers an incentive of free certification to the SMEs to enable their access to the market.

To cope with the high demand for certification, UNBS has decentralized services to its regional offices across the country. UNBS regional offices in Gulu cater for northern Uganda enterprises, and Mbale for eastern Uganda. Similarly, western Uganda will have a regional office and hence reducing the pressure on the headquarters in Kampala.

UNBS has also offered 500 free certifications to micro and small enterprises, an encouragement to produce competitive quality goods at par with the imports.

"UNBS is now close and accessible to the vast majority of the manufacturers to enable their enhanced competitiveness on the local and international markets," Ebiru asserts.

CEREALS CERTIFICATION

Because the cereals and grains sector has attracted much attention for their widespread local consumption and export in the region, UNBS has



instituted mandatory measures for their certification before they are released on the market.

UNBS now mandatorily certifies all maize flour produced for human consumption and hence it needs to be safe. Ugandan maize was in 2021 rejected by Kenya government for its aflatoxin infestation which is harmful to human health, and hence Uganda government directive to have all maize meal processing certified, one of the ways to minimize economic losses.

The government had earlier in 2020 directed UNBS to certify maize and beans and other cereals before they are purchased for epidemics and disasters-affected persons in the country. This was in response to the 2020 pathetic quality maize and beans distribution during the Covid-19. The government was also conned into buying not-fit-for-humanconsumption food from various suppliers for the disadvantaged, which left the people irritated.

The government has since stopped buying maize and beans from non-UNBS-certified suppliers, Ebiru says. UNBS has also engaged the World Food Program (WFP) to start buying the UNBS-certified cereals, which has assisted in quality improvement at par with what WFP imports. This will further assist BUBU to thrive.

Farmers of other produce are also encouraged to take advantage and have their products certified by UNBS from which they stand to gain more economic benefits.

PUBLIC IS TASKED

Ebiru advises the public to adopt a culture of appreciating quality, "When

you are shopping from a supermarket, only buy products which are certified and, therefore, safe. The UNBS label is appended on all certified quality Uganda-made products. Prioritise Ugandan goods when shopping and build Uganda by supporting locally manufacture products. They are competitive."

He also urges the manufacturers, "To seek quality certification, a passport to the local and international markets. UNBS implements the EAC region harmonized standards and is in the process of similar harmonization with other African markets."

By these means, Ugandan UNBScertified products will easily access the markets within the EAC region and Africa on the whole.

lectrical Controls & Switchgear Ltd' (ECS) is an actualization of a passion for **Electrical Switchgear and Controls** operations, dealing with power distribution equipment, and hence ensuring power efficiency, and providing solutions to the power challenges in industries.

The liberalization of the electricity sub-sector created opportunities for private sector players; privately

owned companies were encouraged to develop along with power line constructions and transformers provision and distribution among others.

This was Eng. James Kalibbala's opportunity for translating his passion; the development of Electrical Switchgear and Controls operations into reality, "I am just about the only indigenous transformers manufacturer in Uganda...the rest import knocked

down units for assembly, purporting to manufacture, yet they share in the BUBU benefits."

He started the transformer manufacturing enterprise in 2005 with US\$2million of which US\$1million was a loan which he is about to complete repaying, "Driven by the 'I too can' belief, determination and self-honesty and realization that a gigantic task can be accomplished by breaking it up into smaller parts or units."

Electricity Installation Solutions

Electrical Controls & Switchgear Ltd (ECS) is driven by the commitment to quality and safety. The complete in house manufacturing process helps to ensure optimum quality of the transformer and accompanying switchgear.

It involves safe and cost-effective electricity usage, power distribution and supplies to commercial installations and factories, with large consumers power house units like factories, commercial buildings hospitals, universities, which is the company's specialization and niche. ECS provides interfacing equipment between the power grid operator and the energy user. The user/ consumer turns the invisible electricity power into light, heat, mechanical force and other energy forms to accomplish their desired functions.

ECS also provides Power Audits, helping the large power consumers to understand the economics of power usage. A power Audit will help the consumers to improve their energy efficiency and reduce the energy bill if the proposed mitigations are implemented.

It is important to understand that grid operators penalize large electricity consumers for their poor energy usage (low power factor). ECS therefore provides the solutions for improved energy efficiency by reducing the energy losses for which manufacturing and commercial installations would be heavily penalized through their monthly energy bill.

Most commercial installations are designed by electrical consultants who determine the energy requirements and then accordingly design the power house requirement that ECS turns into reality according

to the specified parameters.

ECS has hence supplied the interface enabling safe power utilization for the specific desired outcomes to many new factories and expanded the existing and ongoing manufacturing facilities. The most recent is Movit Company (cosmetic products manufacturers) where the company has supplied and installed a range of switchgear equipment.

Now in the sixth year of transformers manufacturing, ECS supplies Umeme, Uganda Electricity Distribution Company Limited (UEDCL), Rural Electrification Agency (REA), private power-line contractors and several private installations around the country.

Professional and flexible, the Company guides its clients to understand and appreciate the specifics of the designs of the equipment which will be custom made. The power provider may also specify certain requirements to be met before delivering the power to avoid bad power feedback.

Challenges

The need for skilled manpower was critical at ECS as it started

transformer manufacturing, necessitating the training of technicians and hence five technicians were sent for twomonths training in India.

Interestingly though, Uganda Revenue Authority (URA) required the company to pay 15 percent withholding tax, but luckily a foreign partner stepped in and helped. The tax man could not appreciate the efforts of acquiring a skill that was not available in the country. However, ECS factory now carries out such training in-house with the support of the manpower that trained abroad.

Yet that was only the beginning of the tests of Mr. Kalibbala's manufacturing resolve. When built, Umeme could not buy ECS transformers without their due quality certification (Type Test), yet the standards custodian, Uganda National Bureau of Statistics (UNBS) did not have the requisite standards, the basis for certification.

In the year 2016, four of Kalibbala's transformers were shipped to a certified provider in India for certification at no small cost; three of them passed. Five years on, UNBS still does not have the standard; standardization is demand driven and hence UNBS concentrates on supermarket sold products.

However, Eng. Kalibbala, UNBS Board Member understands the standards' body's challenges, which are basically financial yet the technically challenging certifications needs remain. To get around the challenge, ECS has built its own routine-type test lab which UNBS recognizes enabling the appropriate tests of the newly manufactured and repaired transformers at the premises.

This is unlike the competitions whose parent manufacturers' certifications the subsidiaries assembling transformers in Uganda use. In other respects, UNBS uses international standards for Ugandan exports, lest prospective exporters are held back. UNBS monitors ESC's manufacturing procedures, annually calibrating the production equipment before they are used in products' testing.

On the whole, locally produced goods are safe; you are better off buying local, yet there is the troublesome mistrust of Ugandan made transformers, perceived to be risky by some prospective customers. This cannot be overlooked, and hence the clarion calls for mindset change in favour of local products. Interestingly though, many Ugandan products are of superior quality to the competition imports, which are cheap and of poor quality, but imported for profits maximization.

One year into transformer manufacturing in the year 2016, Uganda Investment Authority (UIA) voted ESC the 'Investor of the year for the medium category' for its innovation. However, whereas the factory is built on two acres of land that the company bought, its growth demands the expansion of its processes.

While some investors otherwise acquire land at no cost in UIA designated industrial parks, the ever to remain Ugandan Ugandans, the indigenous investors' struggles to access land in the designated industrial parks often come naught.

It is also disturbing that the Counterfeit Bill which parliament passed and forwarded for assent about 20 years ago still lies in limbo, while the private sector runs the country through the taxes they pay. In this regard, the private sector deserves some appreciation and respect for their contribution of more than 60 percent to the national budget.

ituated at Kyengera on Kabaka Foundation Road and in operation since 2014 BestEver is among Uganda's leading packaging materials manufacturers. It has progressed from a production capacity of eight tonnes per month in 2014 to the current 500 tonnes/month in 2022.

The company produces laminated

sacks, sewing yarn, shopping bags... (Pc woven sacks are largely used by farmers for farm produce; maize, beans, soya, sesame). Laminated bags are used in carrying processed foods like the flours; they are nonporous and thus impervious to filtration of foreign elements from the external environment and weevil infestations and hence prevent contamination.

The bridled ropes are used by small-scale herders for tethering their livestock; for their resistance to degradation by moisture, they are superior to the sisal ropes which are susceptible to disintegration with exposure to moisture.

BestEver also manufactures sewing yarn for manufacturers. It is used, much like threads, to sew up the packaging sacks' and laminated bags' tops; they are usually consumed by sugar manufactures and flour millers. It is the material used through hand-driven sewing machines to close the bags.

Abuhbaker B. Luzinda is the BestEver Paper Products leading shareholder and its managing director. He is a professional accountant, for the last 26 years, working with and hence exposed to various manufacturers. In the process, he was deeply involved in numerous project evaluations and hence got versed with the mechanics of manufacturing success.

He says the company's decision to major in the manufacture of packaging solutions was informed by the necessity to meet and solve the customers', the farmers' needs.

Prior to BestEver's entry into the packaging materials industry, the need for packaging materials for agricultural produce in the country was critical; farmers would suffer losses because the imported bags would easily come apart when filled. They were cheap and of poor quality, yet quite costly to the users, considering the loss of produce they caused.

Thus BestEver worked out a solution to deliver quality and dependable packaging for agro-produce. Its flagship product, the propylene woven sacks, is basically made of a bio-degradable organic compound and is only one-sixth of the cost of a sisal bag.

BestEver came entered the industry to provide a solution and hence it has maintained the products' quality along with its initial customers, attesting to their satisfaction; they have no reason for looking elsewhere for similar products. Whereas the goods are sold wholesale to the distributors, the smallest unit is a package of 1,000 bags; it is the distributors that drive the networks that get the products to the endusers, the farmers.

BestEver's outstanding attribute is honesty; the bags' quality has stood the test of time over the eight years of production. Market surveys have established that the end customer has consistently valued the product's quality and hence they make repeated purchases from the distributors.

The company is not shy of Uganda National Bureau of Standards (UNBS) and hence it has conducted quality audits and certified its products, thus enhancing its standing in the industry. The disused oils are sold to other industrialists for various applications inclusive of timber and wood preservation and hence nothing is disposed of in the environment.

Further, an environment consulting company has been contracted; it advises the company's on its environment conduct. The company is also engaged in the greening of its environment.

"Come and enjoy BestEver products, the good packaging products, and brand labeling. The packaging materials are accessible in all the big towns and wherever there is a need; even in Burundi, Congo, Rwanda, and South Sudan and to some extent in Kenya and Tanzania, Mr. Luzinda says.

Hon. Katumba Wamala advises local engineers and contractors to pool expertise, resources, and all it takes to get government support and hence meet the competitive standards for winning big infrastructure construction contracts. PPDA's a powerful tool procurement's socio-economic achievements

he Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) is committed to empowering local entrepreneurs, and preparing them for handling big projects. The reservation schemes' target is to impact the manufacturing industries in the country especially those in the construction industry inputs.

Ugandan-manufactured cement and steel procured value for large projects

have increased, relative to what they were before Covid-19 lockdown in 2018/19, courtesy of the PPDA measures.

They earned Shs 30bn from the construction projects in the country, according to the PPDA spokesperson, Chris Magoba, "Isimba and Karuma Hydro Power projects construction and National Water and Sewerage Corporation consumed plastic pipes and shared business deals worth more than Shs 30bn."

Before the issuance of PPDA reservation schemes quidelines, more than 90 per cent of the electricity power transmission cables would be imported from China and India. However, Uganda Electricity Distribution Company Limited (UEDCL) has since the last financial year reserved power line construction contracts worth Sh38b to the national and resident providers of which

Shs 2.gbn was spent on cables and conductors procurement.

Yet the Engineers Registration Board (ERB) notes that local engineers often miss out on big lucrative projects' contracts because of the high bar on requirements that make their qualification difficult.

At a meeting with Uganda National Association of Building and Civil Engineering Contractors (UNABCEC), the Minister of Works and Transport Hon. Katumba Wamala urged them to pool resources, skills, and technical know-how if they are to be competitive and win government contracts.

He cited a company that was invited for vetting and one engineer showed up. The engineer was the company and answerable to every inquiry. "Such a presentations renders you below average; pool resources, expertise, and abilities if you are to be competitive and win contracts," the minister cautioned.

Katumba urged UNABCEC members to write clear and compelling applications because the criteria of assessment during the tendering process are exacting, but meeting the criteria minimises the possibilities of failure of an application after submission. The quality of a presentation is critical in the consideration process for a major engineering systems supplier and is indicative of how the tendering

for design and build contracts sits with the tender classification and processing models.

Katumba noted that opportunities abound in the oil drilling sector besides the numerous road construction projects whose independent tendering process is through a corporate rationale.

He advised local engineers and contractors to pool expertise, resources, and all it takes, to get government support and hence meet the competitive standards for winning big infrastructure construction contracts. Local contractors would benefit from forming consortia, thus

According to PPDA records, Shx 1.1 trillion has been shared among local and resident companies in the 2018/19 financial year, in the roads, cement, steel, and civil works construction sectors. easily lobbying other financiers and development partners for support, and hence increasing their capability for handling big projects.

The minister promised the engineers government financial assistance to address the capital deficiencies and lack of vital machinery challenge that impedes their competitiveness for lucrative infrastructure projects.

The minister noted that whereas the government spends an average of Shs 4 trillion annually on infrastructure projects, most are awarded to foreign firms, because local ones do not have the necessary technical capabilities.

Government's reservations schemes will stimulate the construction industry's growth and enhance employment opportunities for the country's highly youthful population. "The government is prioritizing citizens' participation infrastructure development. in without which the nation is bound to backslide on its human development agenda," Katumba says.

The PPDA objectives include instituting credible public procurement and disposal systems, setting standards for monitoring





the compliance with procuring and disposing of entities and building the country's procurement and disposal capacity.

The PPDA director for Performance Monitoring Dr. Byaruhanga Mwesigwa says switching to the amended procurement regulations and the digitization of the procurement process is designed to curb time wastage.

"It reduces the procurement timelines, and checks bribery that could result from physical interfaces, although corruption could intensify especially at the implementation stage," he says.

Technology inevitably comes in as a handy virtual business transacting, as the post-Covid-19 lockdown new normal has evidenced.

According to PPDA records, Shs 1.1 trillion has been shared among local and resident companies in the 2018/19 financial year, in the roads, cement, steel, and civil works construction sectors.

Shs 736.9bn was spent on operators in the roads sector, from various contracts awarded by Uganda National Roads Authority (UNRA). This stood for 28 per cent of the Shs 2.6 trillion which UNRA operated for the year ending 2018/19.

Shs 574bn (22 per cent) worth of contracts were reserved for national and resident providers, while Shs 162bn (6 per cent) was awarded through mandatory subcontracting by foreign providers.

"Most of these were mechanized maintenance of selected unpaved national roads, reconstruction of washed out and failed bridges in Northern Uganda and routine maintenance of Kampala-Entebbe expressway under UNRA Kampala station contracts. Others are drainage improvement works, design and build strategic bridges constructions on the national roads network and routine maintenance of paved roads under Kampala Station among others," PPDA executive director, Benson Turamye

He said Shs 212bn of Kampala Capital City Authority's (KCCA) Sh406bn budget was spent on civil works, for the design, update, construction, and upgrades of roads in Kampala Capital City Authority.

KCCA has also reserved the supply of construction materials worth Shs 33bn for routine maintenance and improvement works to only national and resident companies through framework contracts.

The materials include asphalt, bitumen, and asphalt paving plant, murram / gravel, drainage maintenance equipment, and earthmoving equipment.

The new reservations will boost local companies' capacity to compete

for big contracts with foreign conglomerates in the long term, and structure the local construction and manufacturing industries.

In 2017, the government reserved all contract works worth Shs 10bn and below for Ugandan firms, as part of efforts to build local capacity. Further, 30 per cent of the value of procurement for the above contracts, Shs 45bn by foreign companies has been reserved for local suppliers, as the government promotes local content in public procurement.

PPDA Executive Director, Benson Turamye says public procurement is a powerful tool for achieving socioeconomic objectives as it operates at the intersection of the government's regulatory and buying powers.

Stanbic Business Incubator programme



Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) are important for their contribution to employment, economic growth, innovations and the diversity of competition they bring to the markets for inclusiveness and sustainable economic growth.



Tony Otoa Okao is the Head of Enterprise Development, representing the Business incubator SME development programme at Stanbic Bank Uganda.

He shared Stanbic Bank's approach to unlocking this strategic development potential and various stakeholders' lives' transformation, especially in the SME sector in an interaction with Immaculate Wanyenze.

The excerpts:

Briefly share with us the incubation concept at Stanbic Bank

The Incubator is a subsidiary of the holding company; so, it is a sister company to Stanbic Bank. Our mandate is to support SMEs businesses when it comes to getting them to be more sustainable and more vibrant.

Uganda is supposedly the most entrepreneurial country in the world, yet when you look at the trend of the SMEs' 'deaths' every year or those that do not progress through their second birthday, the reality is that they are quite many. We are, therefore, trying to support them to survive and be more existent.

We started the Business Incubator in 2018, premised around Uganda's nascent Oil & Gas sector. We, however, expanded into many other sectors including agriculture; we are, therefore, very much around micro, small and medium enterprises in Uganda.

Besides agriculture and the Oilg Gas sector, where else do you have a presence?

We started off with the Oil and Gas sector, but we decided to also focus on transport and logistics, civil works construction, hospitality, catering and other associated service sectors.

It is then that we realized there was massive need from many other areas that were going through turbulent times like the tourism sector and also the agricultural sector which was very promising especially after the COVID lockdown.

We, therefore, also focused our energies on these sectors with the

desire to see, mainly young people and women taken out of this poverty loop. As a matter of fact, most of our interventions are very focused around this group in Kampala and across the country. This is to ensure that we get them into the financial inclusion conversations and also support them to thrive.

Talk of the type of support available to the SMEs, courtesy of Stanbic Bank's Incubator programme...

We have a supplier development, a training programme where we train the businesses for a certain period of time. It depends on one's business because our business operational skills are always segmented and custom-tailored to the needs of the entrepreneurs.

Mature businesses go through a three-month programme that culminates into coaching and mentorship. We cater for the early stage SMEs under our Micro Enterprise Development Program, which is largely implemented in the districts; we operate coordinated trainings through our four regional hubs of Gulu, Mbale, Mbarara and Hoima.

For those SMEs that are based in the central region and have been in operation for more than a year, we support them through our accelerator program.

Now beyond the training, we also support them with grants, and access to finance, which does not only come from the bank but also from our partners through grants. I believe it is the best way we can support the access to the finance situation that many businesses complain about.

We have training facilities and office

facilities where businesses can at least operate in a very professional environment especially if they are dealing with external clients or people who desire to work with them.

We are thus very much supportive of these businesses, which are for free; it is eventually taken over by the funding structures which we have in place and also the different funders who we have brought on board.

Please talk of the spread of the Incubation programme and its success this far....

We started out from Kampala, and then we moved out to over 27 districts in the country. We have impacted close 3580 entrepreneurs since 2018 and trained over 2,500 businesses, a very interesting trend to us. Recent evaluation indicates that more than 80 percent of the businesses that have been with us get more support.

Over 50 percent of the businesses contracted in the Oil and Gas sector have been part of the incubator program. Indeed they have trained with Stanbic Bank's Incubator and looking at their financial trends over the years, they have proved their relevance even after five years. I think this speaks to us of what we are trying to do to support these businesses.

Besides the businesses that bank with Stanbic Bank; Stanbic Bank's Incubator is open to any other business that banks with other banks.

Please educate the public on procurement and disposal training...

One of our biggest offerings to most of the trainees is our supplier / bid management training. We have success stories where one will tell you that while they had been bidding for years, two bids they have made this year sailed through.

This is because they have adopted the fundamentals we take them through; the PPDA guidelines, guidelines on how to submit responsive tenders, risk management and formation of agreements.

This is a very important course especially for the businesses in the service sector.

Local private sector gains, challenges

t is the view at the Private Sector Foundation - Uganda (PSFU) that most firms participating in BUBU are the nascent Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) that still need support.

To build their capacity, PSFU is implementing a number of programs to improve Ugandan entrepreneurs and service providers' skills, quality and visibility, as they look to supplying the local and regional markets.

Mr. Stephen Asiimwe, the executive director, says much money has been injected in the skills development facility (SDF) over the years, to improve the skills of local entrepreneurs, and arm young graduates with employable skills as well.

SDF is a World Bank-funded initiative aimed at training, building capacity and improving the quality of skills to enhance human capital competencies; innovation and competitiveness.

Through the fund, FSFU is creating a pool of skilled labor to satisfy the gap created by demand from BUBU, "PSFU has also partnered with international trainers and certifiers like City and Guild, to train Ugandan entrepreneurs on quality, a requirement of the oil and gas sector," Asiimwe says.

The program imparts skills, inclusive

of market sustainability, versatility, global market standards, marketing and branding and preferences of the African market. It complements government's role in skilling Ugandans through the Ministry of Education and Sports, thus impacting the beneficiaries through the acquired competitive technical skills.

Uganda's private sector comprises about 80 percent Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) that greatly need skilled human capital to be competitive on the local, regional and global markets.

Asiimwe says, "There is disconnect between the policy and its implementers, which explains why government departments still buy foreign goods including biscuits, tea and coffee. On a macro scale, the disconnect is so stark that some businesses find it difficult to take advantage of or contribute to the BUBU effort."

He elaborates that several Ugandan-registered companies have ignored the BUBU policy guidelines and import raw materials that can otherwise be locally sourced, "Instead of supporting local producers by buying the raw There is disconnect between the policy and its implementers, which explains why government departments still buy foreign goods including biscuits, tea and coffee. materials locally, many producers source them from abroad, for which reason the authorities need to enforce the BUBU policy."

He says in addition, many companies employ expatriates in jobs for which Ugandans qualify, citing lack of skills, honesty, exposure, and experience, "But we have enough skills to take up a project of any size. It is the lack of synergy, and local government laws to protect local players. Therefore, the issue of why Ugandans are not accessing good business deals should be dealt with candidly with all stakeholders, including the government."

Over the years, a marked reduction in the number of Ugandan companies scooping business deals from multinationals has been registered, thus calling for advocacy and affirmative action in this area.

Further, PSFU has partnered with the MasterCard Foundation under the young Africa works program, to create three million meaningful jobs, an intervention into Uganda's large, unemployed youth population.

"We are creating business opportunities in tourism, agriculture, allied trade services, construction and real estate and ICT. The reason is that these are among the fastest-growing industries and can, therefore, absorb so many people," he observes.

Under the Work Based Learning (WBL), a component of the SDF, students are offered internship opportunities, and thus exposed

to hands-on training under the guidance of a supervisor from different host companies.

"This involves machine handling, technical ability exposure, career guidance, work ethics, and actual interpersonal relationship and professional exposure, among others," Damali Ssali, the PSFU Chief Programs and Projects Officer, says.

To optimize the opportunities inherent in BUBU, Ssali says SMEs need to endeavor to conform to market and buyer requirements, especially the mandatory and voluntary standards such as sanitary and phytosanitary requirements. In addition, they will do well to differentiate their products from the competition to establish and strengthen their market position.

"Effective branding and brand management tailored to the target market is key for SMEs aiming to benefit from a relationship with big multinationals, under the BUBU policy arrangement. It is hence important that they strengthen their distribution systems to ensure effective coverage and availability of the products to their multinational consumers whenever they need them," Ssali advises.

In 2014, Uganda cabinet approved the Buy Uganda-Build Uganda (BUBU) policy to promote the consumption and procurement of locally produced goods and services.

The idea would be given force through legislation imposing local content obligations on persons who uses public money, natural resources or carry out an activity that requires a license, to prioritise Ugandan citizens and resident companies owned by citizens.

In 2017, the BUBU policy and its regulations were launched, giving a significant push in local production capacity for goods and services.

According to retired minister of Trade, Industry and Cooperatives Ms. Amelia Kyambadde, this would stimulate the growth of local industries, increase government revenue and reduce unemployment and create wealth for Ugandans by increasing local products consumption.

Over the years, Kyambadde says, production capacity, standards and demand for local goods have gone up, in all sectors of the economy, in accordance with the intended purposes of Bubu.

Further, the Public Procurement and Disposal of Public Assets Authority (PPDA) says close to Shs 2 trillion has in the 2020/21 financial year been shared among local and resident companies through construction related procurements.

The biggest chunk in the roads sector relates to Uganda National Roads Authority (UNRA) Shs 900bn awarded contracts.

URA rolls out Warehousing System to streamline cargo management

n a bid to enhance cargo management and accountability in bonded warehouses, Uganda Revenue Authority has launched the Bonded Warehouse Information Management System (BWIMS) to address the challenges of the increased volumes of goods movement through the bonded warehouses.

The solution is also expected to improve cargo supply chain visibility, information sharing, ease stock management and facilitate cargo clearance in bonded warehouses.

The implementation of the system follows a World Bank report of 2018 that noted that about 95% of entries coming from Mombasa Port use the bonded warehousing facility to get goods entering into Uganda. This has had an effect on efficient cargo control and revenue collected.

The report also recommended automating processes and procedures and enhancing the monitoring of restricted entry into customs controlled areas to manage bonded warehouses. The absence of a comprehensive inventory management system has also been a challenge in our warehouses and has had an impact on revenues. These and more have been challenges affecting a number of warehouses.

BWIMS is a win-win situation for Bond operators, bond keepers, the business community and URA, who will all benefit from the modern warehousing operations that ensure a safe and secure supply chain process at all clearance stages. The roles and responsibilities for the Bond operators/ keepers, clearing agents, transporters and bond officers have been streamlined. The cargo loaders' role is now validated; they will be registered in the system as key players in the cargo management process.

Advancing technology and integrating systems are key drivers for business efficiency and revenue growth in modern warehouses. As a result, importers and exporters will benefit from the automated warehousing services, including the request for verification at owners' premises, garage repairs, temporary releases, bond transfers, and more.

The effectiveness of BWIMS largely depends on the authenticity of the pre-arrival information or documentation and detailed examination accounts. Falsification of documents or information is an offence per EACCMA section 202 and 203 and punishable.

The system that has so far piloted with 6 bonded warehouses; Spedag Interfreight, COSMOS, Liberty, Lexus, Toyota CFAO and Victoria Motors.

For now, all bonded warehouses are expected to adhere to the new licensing requirements of Bonded Warehouses, conduct thorough stock audits and ensure that all overstayed cargo is cleared to avoid being auctioned.

The URA is also continuously conducting awareness activities and trainings for all bonded warehouse operators during this period to build capacity and raise awareness about BWIMS. Furthermore, engagements with bonded warehouse owners are ongoing to have extended operational time at the various bonded warehouses over the weekends.

URA is committed to streamlining and improving its processes, procedures and systems to ensure they are simple, integrated, reliable, interactive and accessible.

Laws like The Petroleum Act, Upstream Regulations and the Petroleum Suppliers Act have been passed to ensure that the country optimally benefits from the petroleum resources, and that at least 40 percent of the oil and gas contracts are reserved for Ugandan companies.

Oil & Gas Production Ugandans in Significant Local Content Gains

o ensure the existing and future generations' maximum benefit from the national oil and gas resources, Uganda government in 2008 passed the National Content Regulations relating to the development of the oil and gas industry. Subsequently, on May 20, 2020, Parliament passed the National Local Content Bill, 2019. By so doing, the government sought to harness the oil and gas resources to register early achievements in the fight against poverty, through the citizens' direct participation in the two resources' extraction and processing.

According to Lyoida Kiconco, UNOC Head of Exploration and New Ventures at Uganda National Oil Company Limited (UNOC), the policy, therefore,

mandates oil and gas operators to train, employ and transfer technology to local employees. They are also required to practice procurement preference for Ugandan-made goods and services, and where they are not available, then import similar products through joint ventures with Ugandan companies.

Nonetheless, enabling Ugandan citizens and enterprises to participate in the supply of goods and services to the desired levels requires significant effort, support and collaboration amongst the relevant stakeholders.

Other laws like The Petroleum Act 2013, Upstream Regulations and the Petroleum Supply Act 2003 provide for and safeguard the country's optimal benefits from the petroleum resources; at least 40 percent of the oil and gas contracts are reserved for Ugandan companies.

The head of national content at Uganda National Oil Company (UNOC), Jessica Kyeyune says a number of key players from the private sector are participants in the upstream segment of the oil and gas industry.



Ms. Proscovia Nabbanja steers UNOC, being its Chief Executive Officer. Mr. Ernest Rubondo, the Executive Director at PAU, says the interested and with the competence to work in the oil and gas sector can register on the international oil and gas talent register.

There are a number of opportunities since the final investment decision was reached, which have opened close to US\$15bn earnings into the economy in the next three to five years.



"There are a number of opportunities since the final investment decision was reached, which have opened close to US\$15bn earnings into the economy in the next three to five years. The year 2023 is expected to be characterized by key infrastructure development at the Kingfisher and Tilenga wells. Ugandans are expected to participate in the variety of opportunities that will be available," she says.

Ugandan contractors have won civil works' tenders for the Kingfisher and



Tilenga wells, as the country looks to the year 2025 for the commencement of oil production; contracts worth US\$6bn have been approved, of which nearly US\$1.7bn has been clinched by Ugandan companies, according to Kyeyune.

Sixteen (16) areas have been ring fenced for Ugandan enterprises, and can only be accessed by external players in the event that Ugandans do not qualify. They are fabrication and welding, electric installation, personnel, transportation, security, foods and beverages and hotel services. Others are human resource management, office supplies, customs clearance, fuel supply, land surveying, clearing and forwarding, crane hire, and locally available construction materials' supplies.

To work and benefit from the sector however, Ugandans need to have trained and acquired the requisite technical skills and certifications. The consideration for determining the areas ring-fenced for Ugandans was the perceived ease of their local sourcing, and in the process allowing Ugandans to participate in their national resource upstream production.

It is a requirement that Ugandans with the interest and competence to work in the oil and gas sector must register on the international oil and gas talent register, from which potential employers view and appreciate talent and recruit.

"Nationalization plans are also in place to facilitate the expatriates passing / transfering of skills and knowledge over a given period of time to local employees. Specific emphasis is placed on the training and skilling of Ugandans and hence expatriate oil companies submit their training plans for their staff, and communities," she says.

MSMEs training program is also underway in line with enterprise development in ten districts along the EACOP line; 130 enterprises from four of the ten districts have benefited from the training.

Further, suppliers' development workshops are held for the dissemination of the emerging trends and issues in the oil and gas sector to enable them secure contracts in the oil sector. UNOC is also lobbying for a national content fund to enable those with contracts in the oil and gas sector to access affordable financing for contracts execution.

Ms. Lyoida Kiconco, UNOC head of exploration, says the government has constructed a multibillion fuel storage facility in Kampala, with capacity for more than 70 million liters. It is expected to support the transportation of fuel through Kisumu Kenya Port on Lake Victoria to Kampala using wagon ferries, thus halving the cost of fuel transportation.

Presently, petroleum products like diesel, gasoline, kerosene and jet A1 are transported by road making it costly, susceptible to adulteration, accidents and uncertain supplies.

"Like in all other projects, we have ensured that local content is observed in the construction of Kampala and Jinja fuel reserves. The reservation for local contractors and suppliers in this project is 51 percent," she says.

It is expected that Kampala Storage Terminal will reduce Uganda's petroleum products (fuel) shortages that usually lead to speculative and sometimes abnormal fuel prices hikes. The enhancement of the petroleum products supply security will also cause the activation of

suppressed demand.

UNOC is confident that this will discourage the setting up of numerous mini-storage facilities around Kampala and their associated potential for environmental pollution and petroleum products fires.

The executive director, Southern and Eastern Africa Trade Information and Negotiations Institute (SEATINI) Uganda, Ms. Jane Nalunga says the country needs to strategize to increase her stake in the entire oil and gas project. The government also needs to support the enterprises by mobilizing and facilitating them with more affordable credit, for they are small, weak and have little capital.

For her part, Private Sector Foundation Uganda publicist, Cathy Lindoha says although local participation of the private sector is still small, efforts are ongoing to increase their stake in the oil and gas sector.

The mobilization and sensitization aimed at encouraging the private sector to register on the national oil and gas database is ongoing, and is expected to yield good results in the medium to long term.

Lindoha says PSFU has partnered with international trainers and certifiers like City and Guild, to train Ugandan entrepreneurs per the oil and gas sector quality requirements.

supporting government entities to automate their services and increase the use of E-Services across the country to transform public service delivery.

In addition, several entities are providing online public services categorised by the primary delivery models of e-Government; Governmentto-Citizen or Government-to-Consumer (G2C); Governmentto-Business (G2B); Governmentto-Government (G2G); and Government-to-Employees (G2E).

The development of online systems has reduced human interactions and minimized delays, for instance;

 The E-visa system developed by the Directorate of Citizenship and Immigration Control, has reduced application time for work permits, special pass, and certificate of residence from 1 month to three working days.

- The Online Wealth Declaration system owned by the Inspectorate of Government has reduced human interactions and improved transparency by enabling online wealth declaration of over 30,000 civil servants.
- The E-Citie Portal developed by Kampala Capital City Authority has reduced application time for a trading licence from 24 hours to 15 minutes. Additional services for revenue collection, registration of property and taxi operators have been made available on this portal.
- The E-Citizens portal developed by NITA-U has provided a central location for seventy-one (71) E-Government services. This

has reduced delays and eased the lives of citizens seeking various public services at their convenience.

The National Information Technology Authority - Uganda (NITA-U) was established by an Act of Parliament (National Information Technology Authority, Uganda Act of 2009). Its overall mandate is to coordinate, promote and monitor the development of Information Technology (IT) in the context of social and economic development of Uganda.

Simply put, NITA-U is the Government of Uganda's IT thinking and implementation arm. Given its national role, NITA-U oversees all the ministries/agencies IT development and provides overall IT technical guidance to ensure rational implementation of IT across Government.

NITA'Us strategic intention is to guide Government from an environment that had isolated MDA systems and built in silos with high IT maintenance costs to an environment that will have IT infrastructure, interoperable, interconnected Government MDA systems, with lower IT maintenance costs.

The overall objective / function is to see lives of citizens transformed through e-Service delivery.

NITA-U has registered a number of achievements by performing its functions:

Broadband Geographic Reach Connectivity

With 4000km of Optical Fiber Cable added onto the Government National Backbone Infrastructure (NBI. Greening of 25 NBI Transmission sites completed with all sites connected to solar energy.

NITA-U supports the development and rollout of e-Government services in Government through its technical advisory services, project management support and consultancies in the scoping, designing, acquisition,



implementation and maintenance of applications and systems.

Government System Integration Platform

Ninety-three (g3) entities have been integrated onto the Government Systems Integration Platform (UG-HUB). They are the ministries, departments and agencies and banks. They can now seamlessly share data across this platform. Its increased efficiencies and timeliness in public service delivery across Government eases the access to information and digital payments.

Centralized Hosting for Government

As part of the rationalization of ICT services across Government, ISO Tier 3 National Data Center and Disaster Recovery Site were put in place. The facility hosts (209) applications for ninety-five (95) Government entities.

Government Unified Messaging and Collaboration System (UMCS) has been provisioned in different organizations, to rationalize and harmonize IT initiatives and services in Government. It provides a uniform mailing platform for Government communication and enhances efficiency in information sharing. Over 134 Government institutions are using the unified e-mail and communication services.

Government SMS/USSD Gateway has also been developed as a Shared Platform for dispatch of BULK SMS by different government ministries departments and agencies. This e-service had been provisioned to 32 MDAs, utilizing a total of 22 services.

NITA-U is in the final stages of rolling out the Digital Authentication and Electronics Signatures solution (Ug-Pass).

As part of the extension of support to the agricultural sector through RCIP, the Agro-Input Traceability System was developed with the Seed, Agro-Chemical and the Phytosanitary Module.

The National CERT Environment

The National CERT Coordination Center and solution was set-up and is fully operational to enhance cyber security coordination for different stakeholders.

Together with Ministry of Education, UNICEF and NCDC, NITA-U is providing a free digital learning tool (Kolibiri) to enable children to study and learn from the comfort of their homes in keeping with the preventive corona disease prevention guidelines.

The Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries, with NITA-U support, is using e-Voucher, a mobile-based system that is being used by farmers to purchase critical farm inputs with support from government.

The beneficiaries include 292,475 farmers, and 165 accredited Agro Dealers from 57 districts. The famers have been drawn from 300 areabased Commodity Cooperative Enterprises comprising 3,000 Rural Producer Organizations.

NITA-U has supported Inspectorate of Government with Online Declaration System: which has made declaring wealth very convenient; it now takes 20 minutes online.

E-Visa

A few years back tourists and other non-Ugandans would travel to Uganda without visas but would get their visas on arrival. They now apply for their visas online and get their visas online before coming to the country, which has helped to save time.

NITA-U has developed an E-licensing system for the National Forestry Authority (NFA). The system which was designed by NITA-U provides an efficient, automated platform for registration, licensing, transfers, harvesting and enables NFA to disseminate information to Tree farmers.

It enables online application for tree planting and allows farmers to access information about their application status, make online payments and access payment information, among other features.

During the implementation of Regional Communication Infrastructure Program, (RCIP) NITA-U gave out of 700 laptops to accelerate the adoption of e-services in Government. The 700 laptops were procured and distributed to the government ministries, departments, cities, district, municipal councils, town councils, hospitals & health centres, public libraries, divisions among others.

NITA-U is in charge of Government IT Service Desk which is a Single Point of Contact for IT service delivery for IT related support for Ministries, Departments, Agencies and Local Governments. The Government Service Desk under NITA-U is always on hand to ensure their prompt resolution.

NITA-U Next Step

NITA-U is in the final stages of planning for the implementation of Uganda Digital Acceleration Program (UDAP), which is designed to accelerate Uganda's digital transformation and hence achieve the aspirations of the Digital Transformation for Africa initiative.

The project will focus on improving Government connectivity across the country especially in underserved areas and host communities, establishment of a 3rd National Data Centre (NDC) to provide additional redundancy for the existing Data Centre Infrastructure, development of E-Government Services and a shared services platform to improve service delivery.

iver Flow International–Science Teachers' Initiative (RIFI-STI), promoting the use of scientific knowledge, is seeking Shs 50 billion to support its services extension to cover the entire African continent.

It is a Ugandan non-government organisation operating in several schools in over 20 districts. Comprising experienced networking science teachers, its primary objective is to improve quality education in Africa.

Also promoting innovation and research

in solving socio-economic challenges, RIFI-STI has recently expanded to South Sudan and Somalia.

Recent studies have highlighted persistent failures and low uptake in science subjects. To bridge the gap, RIFI-STI has resorted to projects like promoting a practical approach to science, capacity building, literacy for lifelong learning and a teacher support center.

To further demonstrate the importance of science, RIFI-STI has formed a partnership with schools to set up science projects, enabling the learners to apply classroom knowledge and acquire skills that are applicable to daily life in the home and school setting, and when they leave school.

By developing practical reading, and learning materials, RIFI-STI enhances the promotion of numeracy and literacy, retools teachers in practical science teaching and increases access to inclusive quality education.

According to Shift Media, the First Lady and Minister for Education and Sports Hon. Janet Kataaha Museveni launched a primary school science kits at State House Nakasero.

"This apparatus, which is aligned with the national curriculum, is intended to make the teaching of every topic of science at the primary level not only practical but also interesting to learners," she tweeted. The mini laboratories will complement textbooks in the teaching and learning of integrated science.

Funding

Since 2017 when it was launched by Hon. Rosemary Seninde, then the Minister of State for Primary Education, it has developed due to partnership with key stakeholder; the Ministry of Education and Sports (MoES), the National Curriculum Development Centre (NCDC), World Vision Uganda, Save the Children and Finn Church Aid Uganda.

"We can accomplish much with funding support for innovation from government. With the available resources, we have improved the quality of education in 20 districts in Uganda through science innovation and expanded to South Sudan, Kenya, and Somalia," Simuka said.

Simuka noted that with full capacity mini-science laboratories production, the entire Great Lakes region and the entire continent will be supplied.

The initiative trains teachers, the hands that feed the learners,

"Therefore, enriching them in the learner-centered teaching approach contributes to the education system betterment. The training is conducted through workshops, and continued in-service training, and seminars. Teachers are guided in use of available materials to engage students in the teaching and learning process, whereas learners participate, see, touch, and feel what they are learning," he added.

Teacher support

RIFI-STIA has a science teachers' support centre where subject specialists respond to inquiries about the teaching content, delivery methodology, or testing, and evaluation. The team also evaluates the learners' response to the new approach.

AGOA in BUBU Drive

The promotion of domestic demand through policies such as BUBU will to a large extent determine the growth rate of the industry's output and, therefore, its productivity growth and export competitiveness.

or his visionary leadership, President Yoweri Museveni was among the first African leaders to endorse the Africa Growth Opportunity Act (AGOA), dutyfree and quota free market access opportunity the USA offered to some African countries.

This was key support to Uganda's quest for economic growth and

development and has proved that trade and not aid can support a country's growth.

Uganda's utilization of the AGOA opportunity has increased the exports to the USA although their value and volumes are yet to match those of the other AGOA beneficiary countries, as the table below indicates.

Uganda's exports to USA under AGOA include casein, dried fruits, cocoa, fish, cut flowers, home decor, textiles, speciality foods such as moringa, shea butter, coffee and spices.

These products are also consumed in Uganda, an indication that their increased consumption has a positive relationship with increased exports. The BUBU policy is key cornerstone to Uganda's increased utilization of the AGOA market access provision.

For BUBU policy to succeed, local firms need to conform to product quality and standards and thus perfectly substituting the imports; this in turn will improve their competitiveness in the external markets, in this case the USA.

Increased domestic demand that BUBU policy promotes supports new industries' growth especially the SMEs, to attain the competitiveness for survival on the international market when they start exporting. This will be possible when the manufacturers improve their products' quality using the feedback they receive from their local consumers.

In addition, domestic demand is a shock absorber for any given product. This was evident during the COVID-19 lockdown; the sales of the products with high domestic demand were not as badly impacted unlike those that were entirely dependent on the export market.

This was so because producers could sustain sales through local demand as they waited for the international market to normalise.

Increased domestic demand enhances a given sector's productivity, which in the end leads to positive

export performance. Low productivity is persistently the biggest hurdle to Uganda's enhancement of product competitiveness because of the related high cost of doing business.

Accordingly, increased domestic demand as aimed at by the BUBU policy will enable improved productivity, hence low production cost and hence final favourable products' competitiveness on the USA market.

Consumer confidence tends to be on a higher side in the foreign market when that product is highly consumed in the domestic market. This is because local consumers promote their product brands, enhancing their attractiveness to the foreign market.

Sanga Vet Chem Ltd

Eastern, Central Africa's Veterinary Drugs Factory

he people and the government of Uganda need to have faith in their own institutions and support them and thus promote Buy Uganda Build Uganda (BUBU) policy implementation, says Sanga Vet Chem Limited Director, Mr. Enos Tumusiime.

He says Sanga Vet Chem Limited is the first factory of its kind in eastern and central Africa "...that's to say, starting from Ethiopia, Sudan, South Sudan, Eritrea, Somalia, Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Rwanda, Burundi and DR Congo."

Tumusiime says the factory is a game

changer in the fight against ticks in animals which have often resulted in the death of 70 percent of livestock.

In 2008 many livestock farmers realized the acaricides were ineffective as many livestock died of tick-borne related diseases; the country had been hit by a wave of counterfeit drugs use. For this reason, "We built this factory to solve the problem at hand; to produce acaricides and combat or kill ticks," he said.

Producing seven products including five acaricides, a de-wormer and a wound remedy, the factory commenced manufacturing in Mr. Enos Tumusiime, Sanga Vet Chem Managing Director.

August 2021, "The five acaricides have undergone clinical field trials per the National Drug Authority (NDA) regulations and are effective against ticks and safe to use."

In addition, Sanga worm and fluke drench, the de-wormers are also undergoing NDA clinical trials. The company also plans to produce a wound remedy, healing oil for wounded animals.

An upbeat Tumusiime assures the farmers that Sanga Vet Chem

products are of higher quality than the competition on the market, "I am a farmer and I had realized the other products were not working before I invested in this venture. Further, by using my company's products, there is no single tick in my herds; farmers who have used our products are also happy and satisfied.

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)

This project is in line with African Union Livestock Development Strategy (LiDeSa) 2015-2035 and the Comprehensive Africa Agricultural Development Program (CAADP).

According to the African Development Bank (2021), the livestock sector globally and across Africa accounts for about 40 percent of agricultural GDP, although that percentage varies from 15 to 80 percent across countries in the developing world.

Hence, the factory has capacity to expand and meet demands of the region, "We are confident of meeting the AU objectives; the percentage of Ugandans who are gainfully employed in the livestock sector, it's promising. Uganda has 15m heads of cattle, Kenya has over 22 million, Tanzania over 30 million while Ethiopia over 70 million," Tumusiime notes.

The factory employs 70 people but

will in six months increase the staff numbers to 300, "We largely employ Ugandans and a few expatriates who are training Ugandans to take up their positions," he added.

NDA Relationship

Mr Tumusiime lauds National Drug Authority for its support, "This is the first factory of its kind, for us and also for them. The only challenge is in having to source raw materials from the US, Europe, China and India when testing our products. They have, nonetheless, helped us set our standards which are international standards."

Environmental protection

Due diligence has been followed and measures put in place by relevant bodies to ensure environmental protection in Sanga Vet Chem's veterinary drugs manufacturing, "Before a factory is built, architectural plans are submitted to the NDA and the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA). An impact environment assessment has to satisfy NEMA before it certifies the project."

Sanga Vet Chem's architectural mechanical design provides for two effluent treatment units on both sides of the factory. The effluent from the factory is treated to be environmentally friendly. However, whereas Uganda Investment Authority is yet to set up an effluent treatment plant in Namanve, Sanga Vet Chem has effectively functioning internal systems, including containment and treatment measures for the few and far between spills on the floor.

Workers safety

The company has in place facilities ensuring workers protection from any harm while working at the factory. Workers' safety is among the processes NDA must certify. It took the company more than ten months to get the air in the de-wormer section cleaned and cleared of bacteria to acceptable standards: air and water quality is assessed for conformity every hour. Further, the factory architecture does not let in air from the outside environment that could contaminate the manufacturing procedures within."

There are three laboratories at the factory, a chemistry laboratory, instruments room, a facility where raw materials and products are produced and a bio technology laboratory where tests for bacteria and analyses of animals' blood samples are done.

Drug practices

Tumusiime advises farmers to be cautious of the drugs they use and where they source them from. The

government too also has an opportunity to control the drugs on the market through the National Drug Authority.

He is concerned over "Farmers who have been using counterfeit veterinary products have seen their cows go blind, others have lost hair and many died; it is painful and a tragedy to the nation. Imagine what a drug that blinds a cow blind could do to a human who consumes that cow's meat or its milk."

The factory also has equipment for assessing farm dip wash for its efficacy. Before Sanga Vet Chem factory was built, farmers would send their dip wash to Nairobi and its quality would have been compromised by the time it was returned. The service is now locally available.

Appeal

Mr Tumusiime appeals to investors in other sectors to venture into import substitution and build production facilities that support local industry, "In agriculture, business or mechanics, we need to set up our own industries rather than source materials from abroad."

He also urges the government to help train farmers, most of whom cannot read and interpret guidelines on many drugs.
